








AREYOU READY?

Where will funds raised go towards?



Medical & Dental Services:

HealthServe's volunteer-run clinic offers heavily subsidised health services which include dental care, specialist consultations, rehabilitation services and chronic disease management.



Mental Health & Counselling Services:

Mental health services such as psychoeducation workshops, crisis helpline support and counselling sessions are provided, with the aim of supporting and strengthening the mental well-being of migrant workers.



Casework & Social Services:

social assistance and
support to migrant
workers struggling with
complex work injuries and
related social or legalrelated issues.


There are over one million work permit holders in Singapore. Access to affordable healthcare and social protection can be a problem for low-wage migrant workers. By law, workers are supposed to be covered for both inpatient and outpatient treatment by their employers but not all are. In addition, a fear of repatriation and cultural and language barriers contribute to migrant workers not receiving proper and timely treatment.

The more unfortunate amongst these workers get injured at work and may end up losing their jobs, incomes and livelihoods for a protracted period. The wait for their work injury compensations can take months or even years.

From a single clinic in Geylang providing GP services, HealthServe has expanded our range of services to include specialist medical services, dental and rehabilitation services, counselling and mental health programmes, casework support and social assistance.

We are very much a volunteer-run organisation. Our operations are run by a small staff team and hundreds of medical and non-medical volunteers and interns.
